Monthly Money Matters-August 2021

The Financial Statement for June 2021 shows that the total income of \$401,356 exceeds total expense of \$306,468 for a net positive cash flow of \$94,888 for the year. Total expense for the year is \$61,240 lower than the 2021 budget. The major savings in expense versus the budget are staff positions currently not filled. In addition, both the Worship and Music and Christian Education Committees have spent less than their 2021 budget year to date.

Tax Saving Opportunity for Those Over 70 ½

For those of you who take the standard deduction at tax reporting time there is a tax savings way to contribute to GVPC. It is called a

Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). You must be at least 70 ½ years old at the time you request a QCD. You can make a contribution to GVPC by taking the funds out of a Traditional IRA or an Inherited IRA and having your IRA custodian issue a check from your IRA payable directly to GVPC. You can request the check be mailed to GVPC, or forward the check to GVPC yourself. If the distribution check is made payable to you, it would be treated as taxable income. The charitable deduction amount can be excluded from your Adjusted Gross Income when you file your taxes. You cannot take a charitable tax deduction on Schedule A if you elect to take the deduction as an exclusion in your adjusted gross income. If you elect to send a QCD directly to the church,

please send a letter or email to our Financial Manager, Carol Johnson at <u>caroljohnson@greenvalleypres.com</u>, to notify her that a check will be mailed to the church. Let her know the name of the IRA custodian, the amount of the check, and what account or accounts to which the donation should be credited.

Missions Report - CARE for AIDS

Africa has been particularly hard hit by the HIV crisis. There are many non-government organizations, both secular and Christian, that have responded by establishing orphanages to care for the children left behind.

CARE for AIDS, a Christian organization which GVPC supports, has taken a different approach. Their purpose is to prevent orphans. They do this by giving individuals infected with HIV the tools they need to live

successful lives. These tools are taught in 9-week sessions that the individuals attend. These sessions provide emotional support, teach economic skills, teach physical care, and offer spiritual lessons.

At graduation, the clients are better equipped to care for themselves so they do not succumb to the virus; they can support themselves through marketable skills they learned and overcome the stigma HIV carries with their families and neighbors and live a life of faith if they have made that decision.

The sessions are offered in 71 centers located in Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda. To date CARE for AIDS has graduated 22,325 individuals; 5354 faith decisions have been made and 70,729 orphans have been prevented!

GVPC is proud to be a part of this effective and successful ministry.
