In thanking GVPC for the gift of Hoodies last year, one of the schools wrote: "We know there are so many schools that need help desperately, and we are so grateful that you have chosen to support our school." Our calls to the schools indicate a tremendous need this year.

We appreciate the many needs you are asked to help support. If you are able and

wish to, the Missions Committee is gratefully accepting donations for its annual Hoodie-Coat Drive through the month of November. Because of the "supply chain issues" this year, the Missions Committee placed early orders with our supplier to ensure we had initial sufficient quantities. There has been a price increase of \$1.50 per Hoodie over last year; yet, we are still able to <u>STRETCH</u> your dollars further in getting quality Hoodies at reduced prices by purchasing them in bulk.

Congregational Meeting

Called meeting of the Congregation November 14, 2021 after Second Service GVPC Sanctuary

The Session of Green Valley Presbyterian Church has called a special meeting of the congregation on November 14, 2021. The meeting will be held after the second service in the Sanctuary.

The items to be brought before the meeting are:

- Affirmation of Reverend Doll's Terms of Call for 2021.
- Affirmation of the election of Elders and Deacons who began service in January 2021 to include suspension of Articles XII and XIV, Deacons and Elders terms of service.
- Amend Article II of the By-laws to allow the annual meeting to be held in either January or February.
- Amend the By-laws to add Article XVIX to provide for the appointment of an Executive Committee when deemed necessary by the Session.
- Temporarily suspend Articles XII and XIV of the By-laws that specify that the Session consist of 18 Elders and the Board of
 Deacons consists of 21 Deacons. It is proposed that the Session consist of 15 elders and the Board of Deacons consist of
 18 Deacons during the year 2022.
- Elect Elders and Deacons to terms on the Session and the Board of Deacons.

Surviving the Holidays

Coping through the holidays becomes a goal for anybody during the busy holiday season that will soon be approaching. For others, it is a time of loneliness that needs some attention. GVPC is pleased to present *Surviving the Holidays*, designed by Church Initiative and published as part of the Grief Share program.

This program has been used by GVPC

and other churches as a way to minimize the lost feeling that some one may be experiencing during the holiday season. Our lives during this period of grieving the loss of someone close to us can be described as 'under re-construction.' This requires trusted companions who listen while the grieving are trying to rebuild their lives again. This is not a lecture, but a combination of video

discussions of how others have coped, allowing you to weave your way through your grief story, either silently or by sharing with others.

The *Surviving the Holidays* session will be presented on Sunday, November 14 from 1:00 -3:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall.

Monthly Money Matters

The Financial Statement below for September 2021 shows total income exceeds total expense for a net positive cash flow of \$142,818 for the year. Total expense for the year is \$76,961 lower than the budget. We are very grateful that the congregation continues to generously give to the operating fund.

As you contemplate the amount you are going to pledge for 2022, it may help knowing how some of your contribution will be used. One of the major uses of your pledge will be devoted to our Christian Education ministry program.

The biggest change for 2022 will be the hiring of a Director of Christian Education. We are budgeting a salary of \$40,000 for this position. When you add in health insurance and taxes, this will increase this expense to \$50,800.

The next largest expense for the CE programs in 2022 is the Triennium. This is a youth ministry event that takes place

every three years. This year it is being moved from Purdue University to the Convention Center in Indianapolis. It is a place where about 10 of our high school age youth will gather together to engage their next steps in faith, exploring the intersection of justice, courage, connection and vision. The 2022 Budget includes \$16,380 for this expense.

We also are looking ahead to restore our Vacation Bible School and be able to send our youth to a week at summer camp. We will now be able to provide regular Sunday afternoon meetings with our children and youth using a more formal curriculum.

As we celebrate Thanksgiving this month, we are very grateful that we can share all that God has provided us by giving to our missions programs. We will continue to provide tuition to a Columbia Theological Seminary student. From an international giving perspective, GVPC supports CARE for Aids (Africa),

One Another Missions (Costa Rica), and Victory Christian Fellowship Church (Jamacia). On a more local basis, we have given to the Presbytery of Nevada Mission Outreach programs, the Henderson Food Bank and the Salvation Army. Our total Missions donations are included in the 2022 Budget at \$51,100.

During this stewardship campaign time, remember that God has provided us with everything we have. God loves it when the giver delights in the giving, for God loves a cheerful giver.
