Money Matters-2020

You all are aware that 2020 has been a year of chaos and uncertainty. The church has held more services livestreamed than in-person which raises obvious questions about the church's financial health. We are grateful to be able to report that it remains strong. As you will see in the spreadsheet below our income came close to matching the budget while expenses were well under budget. Thanks to all who have so faithfully supported your church.

The good financial situation we are experiencing has allowed us to implement some positive changes in the face of this unprecedented pandemic situation. We have made some prudent reductions in expenses but have not had to take any drastic measures.

God has led us in some new directions; directions that we may not have traveled except for the pandemic. He does work in mysterious and wonderful ways.

We have quickly implemented and

developed livestreaming capability so we can continue worship services for our congregation and others who join us from around the world.

We have continued support of our mission partners including:

Friends in the Desert

The pandemic has NOT slowed GVPC down from continuing to provide hot meals, sack lunches, toiletries, and clothing items on the 2nd Saturday of each month to Friends in the Desert throughout 2020! Although the dining room is closed at FITD, our friends are still served carryout meals each day, except Sundays. The GVPC hot meals are prepared by the 7 meal co-chairs, who take the food to the FITD kitchen at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church in downtown Henderson, where it is boxed and served by the staff at FITD. The sack lunches, prepared by the loyal "Lunch Brigade" are brought to GVPC on the

2nd Friday, and are then taken to FITD by sack lunch coordinator, Kurt Ricketts. The sack lunches are distributed along with GVPC's hot boxed meals. Each month we have been serving 85-100 of our friends in need. The clothing coordinator packages the toiletries and purchases clothing items, which are also distributed on that same Saturday.

God bless and thank all of you who continue to support this wonderful GVPC mission with your food, clothing, service, and financial donations for the homeless and food insecure. Volunteers are always welcome to join this fun and fulfilling outreach! If you are interested in

Congregational Meeting Update

As you may know, the by-laws of Green Valley Presbyterian Church call for two congregational meetings each year. One is to be in October for the purpose of electing officers to take office in the following year. The second is to be in January for the purpose of approving the Pastor's terms of call, receiving the annual report and the budget for the year. The two items that are vital for the church to function are election of officers and approval of terms of call.

Given the risks of holding large gatherings, neither meeting was held as required. This presents a problem since our polity requires election of officers and approval of terms of call be done by the congregation. Of course, neither the Book of Order nor the GVPC By-laws anticipated a pandemic so provide no guidance on the matter. Nor has the denomination addressed the issue. The Presbytery has made an attempt but assumes there are provisions in each church's by-laws that address the issue.

Given the above situation, the

Executive Committee appointed Allen Randle and Doug Small to recommend a solution. The recommendation was that the Session take the place of the congregation to elect officers and approve the terms of call with the proviso that the congregation ratify those actions when a congregational meeting is possible.

The Executive Committee agreed with the recommendation and forwarded it to the Session for approval. The Session unanimously approved the plan and has acted on the business at hand.

Class of 2023 - Bug Bond, Rosemary Curry, Amy Iskenderian, Betsy Johnson, Jeremy Mueller and Linda Pardue The incoming Elders will be installed during the livestream service on January 17th; the Deacons on January 24th. Please extend your thanks to these individuals for their willingness to serve in this unusual time.

Pastor Adrian was granted a 3% increase in his Effective Salary (cash plus housing allowance). His PCUSA Medical/Pension/Death & Disability payment, (which is a percentage of his salary) and his SECA allowance increased as well. All other terms are unchanged from 2020.

Full disclosure: Both Regina Golenkov and Allen Randle are serving a seventh year on the Board of Deacons and the Session even though the Book of Order limits individuals to six consecutive years in either position. The unique circumstances of this past year have limited opportunities to develop individuals for these jobs. The Book of Order does allow the Presbytery to grant exceptions to the term limits which it did at its September meeting.
