You Go Nowhere This Week By Accident

Little did I know how much a chance encounter would brighten my time of study leave at Columbia Seminary. One of my colleagues insisted I enjoy some southern barbecue while visiting Atlanta. According to Lindsay, "no self-respecting Southerner can miss the opportunity to introduce a Yankee to Southern Cuisine." We were finishing our BBQ dinner when an elderly couple sat next to us in the crowded diner; and as some people are naturally inclined to do, Bill quickly introduced himself. As the conversation ensued, his wife, Anne, asked what I was doing in Georgia (evidently my accent was a big giveaway that I did not belong).



No sooner did I explain that I was studying at Columbia Seminary, then Anne, a spry woman of 83, threw her arms over her head and exclaimed, "Well, we're Presbyterian too! Isn't this just like the Lord to introduce us!" I think the entire restaurant stopped eating as Anne made her jubilant outburst of praise. Never have I witnessed anyone so proud of their Presbyterian heritage. Bill and Anne introduced themselves and then urged me to visit their church, Decatur Presbyterian, with the promise of a lunch after worship on Sunday. [And by now, you know your pastor will nearly always take up the offer of a free lunch.] But that's not all, Anne said, "Here is our phone number and e-mail. If you need anything this week, you call us!"

Later that week, Bill and Anne phoned to make certain I would be there on Sunday. And by the time I walked through their church doors, I was greeted by no fewer than five people who were looking for me: the pastor, a greeter, a Sunday School teacher, and of course, Bill and Anne. During their warm welcomes, I immediately thought to myself, "Now this is what every church should strive to be: a welcoming community of faith that is always looking for one more way to embrace the stranger in their midst."

As promised, Bill and Anne took me out for lunch. I quickly sensed that I was sitting next to a couple whose evident love of Christ was shaped by years of trusting God in times of joy and tears. These new friends encouraged my heart as they assured me of their prayers for my ministry and studies. In what some might describe as a "chance" encounter, I was reminded in a profound way that God is always orchestrating ways to take care of our needs with unexpected blessings.

I don't know when our paths will cross again, but you can be sure I've found some friends who will always be held near in my heart. And I bet you already know where I plan to worship the next time I'm in Decatur.

Visitors don't just happen to walk through the doors of any church. Most often, they are there because of one person's invitation. As Dick Halverson, former chaplain of the senate, often reminded his congregation: "You go nowhere this week by accident. Wherever you go, whatever you face, God is leading you. He has put you there as His servant. Walk, therefore, in His peace." I hope you'll join me in looking for those Godgiven moments to share the love of Christ with a stranger just as Bill and Anne did for me.

It is doubtful that Munger had any idea how influential this sermon would be when he first delivered it in 1947 at First Presbyterian Church in Berkeley, California. Since its publication in 1951, this creative allegory of the Christian life has been translated in numerous languages. In an imaginative way, Munger compares the life of the Christian to a home as he envisions God's desire to receive an open invitation to each room of our life.

On the 4th Tuesday of every month we meet at 11:30 am for a casual lunch at Barley's located at 4500 E. Sunset Rd.



Life Safety Task Force

The Life Safety Task Force continues to hold regular meetings and make progress in developing an organization plan and writing procedures to deal with various situations that could occur at the church. We will continue to keep you informed of our progress. Training for individuals who will respond to these situations will be conducted once the procedures are in place.

Recently a first aid kit and an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) were procured and installed. The first aid kit is in the multi-purpose building kitchen. We have arranged for the company that sold the kit to inspect it monthly and replace items as they are used. This will insure that supplies are present when needed.

The AED is in the Sacristy in the Sanctuary. The cabinet door is alarmed to alert those in the vicinity when it is opened; the alarm stops when the door is closed. The company that supplied the AED will also inspect it monthly to assure the batteries are charged, the pads in place and the unit is ready for use. Once the pads are placed on a patient, the AED is able to detect if shock is needed and if so will talk the user through the process. However, training is still advised and will be conducted in the near future.

On July 28 our volunteers cleaned the Trail through the Wash area of Green Valley, Mountain View Park, Valle Verde from the Baptist Church to Wigwam, and the church grounds.

Senior Resource Article

During a recent discussion with a friend, who just lost her father-in-law, I started thinking about how much easier it could be for our family if we took more steps toward preparing for our death.

I read a number of online articles on the topic and one that stood out for me was "One Day, You're Going to Die. Here's How to Prepare for It" by Thorin Kiosowski. The portion of the article that especially grabbed my attention was about creating an In-Case-of-Emergency Master File which includes everything about your life so it needs to be kept in a safe place. It should be shared with a close family member or friend.

It includes the items you would expect to find in such a file like a will, letter of instruction, living wills, birth certificates, marriage certificates, citizenship papers, divorce papers, adoption papers, social security numbers and cards, driver's licenses numbers and military records.

The article also includes information one may not think about:

Passwords for websites and other digital information.

Sources of all income.

Financial assets (institution names and account numbers for bank accounts, stocks, bonds mutual funds, pension plans, IRAs, life insurance, etc.)

Real estate.

Other assets (automobiles, boats, precious gems, items in storage, etc.)

Liabilities (phone numbers for credit card institutions, mortgages, personal loans etc.)

Trust documents.

We did our estate planning several years ago, with a lawyer who specializes in that field. We have many of these items pulled together but not all of them. As it has probably been 10 years since we last met with the lawyer, it would be a good idea for us to update everything as things change in that many years. We want to make the task of settling our estate as easy on our family as we can.

FRIENDS IN THE DESERT
