
Here We Go Again!

Monthly Money Matters

January 2019

2018 Year in Review: Financially the church ended 2018 in very good shape. A highlight of the year was a generous donation to the building fund that allowed the loan taken to build the CE Building to be retired. The church has no debt for the first time since moving to our present location. The operating fund also ended the year in good shape thanks to the generous offerings from the faithful members of the congregation. Offerings were \$27,529 over the budget which made up for the loss of the rent income from the Filipino congregation. Overall, income was \$17,134 over budget. Expenses were well controlled by those with responsibility for the various accounts. Spending was \$1597 or 0.23 percent over the \$684,400 budget. Overall income exceeded expenses by \$15,537.

Tax Deferral Opportunities: As you start planning your finances for 2019, we want you to be aware of two methods to give to the church that may offer tax advantages for certain people. The first is from the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) of an IRA. If you are required to make a RMD, you can give up to \$100,000 to recognized charities including your church. The potential advantage of this is that the amount transferred to charity does not have to be shown as income on your tax return; however, the gift cannot be claimed as a deduction if you itemize. This may be of advantage to more people since the latest tax law increased the standardized deduction substantially. To gain the tax advantage, your IRA custodian must send a check directly to the church.

The second method is to donate appreciated stock to the church through Charles Schwab, the church's broker. The advantage of this method is that you do not have to claim the gain on the stock as income but you can claim the value of the shares on the day you donate them as an itemized deduction on your taxes. Please let the church office know if you choose to make a donation in this manner as Schwab does not always know the source of the donated stocks.

If you have questions about how either of these techniques might apply to your situations, contact a tax advisor as the church cannot give tax advice. If you would like more details on how to make your gift with either of these techniques, contact either Allen Randle or Carol Johnson in the church office.
