### **Senior Resources**

#### **Avoiding Scams**

A couple years ago, I wrote several consecutive articles on scams. Between my phone and my computer, I know that I encounter multiple potential frauds every day. Criminals keep getting more and more creative so it was suggested to me, that I might want to touch on this topic again. I often do not answer the telephone anymore and I am extremely cautious before I ever open attachments in my email. Here are some ideas to help you avoid becoming a victim of a scam.

#### **Avoiding Scams**

Never give out personal information such as credit card numbers, bank account numbers, date of birth, or social security numbers to unknown persons or companies.

Do not believe your caller ID because technology makes it easy to fake caller ID information. If you think, the call may be legitimate, call back to a phone number that you know is genuine.

Consider how you pay. Credit cards have significant fraud protection build in but other payment methods do not. Government offices and honest companies will not require you to use payment methods such as Western Union, MoneyGram or gift cards such as iTunes.

Take your time. Con artists want you to make decisions immediately and they do not want to take "NO" for an answer.

Genuine computer firms do not make unsolicited phone calls to help you fix your computer.

Many of us grew up in a more trusting time and it is sad that there are so many dishonest people who use our trustfulness to their advantage. We need to do all we can to avoid becoming a victim of scams.

Sometimes we think that everyone in the church knows what is happening. I was reminded of this by an email that it is not the case. Basically, the concern was that the Worship and Music committee spent over \$100,000 for a piano some thought we did not need without authorization. So, let me give the history behind the purchase of our new piano.

The idea of purchasing another piano started three years ago. At a Session meeting it was approved to use the Instrument Music fund to put the deposited funds given specifically for this project. It was brought to our attention that the Yamaha Piano was starting to have upper register problems so we decided that one better piano would be our goal. Our goal was \$80,000 but we never made a big public push for funds. We let it slowly build by people who wanted it to happen. As you know or may not, we have a Steinway dealer in our congregation. Recently a once in a lifetime deal came about. A family who had bought a concert grand piano years ago wanted to sell it. New, this piano would cost \$140,000 but they were willing to sell it for \$65,000. This was less than the smaller piano costing \$80,000 we were working toward. With the almost \$30,000 we had on hand and the willingness of Denise Wunderlich, the Steinway dealer, to give us the full purchase price we paid for the Yamaha \$24,900 we had about \$10,000 to go. Being on the committee to redo the sound system I knew we did not want to make a public push. I asked the Session to approve me raising funds from those I knew had an interest in the piano. They gave approval. In a few hours the funds were acquired. I don't know where the rumor of \$100,000 price came from, but it is not correct. The price was \$40,100 plus the trade in for a total of \$65,000. I hope this history gives everyone in the congregation the understanding of how our new piano was acquired. This piano will serve this church for years to come. Music has and I hope will continue, to be a major part of our congregation.

for sharing information of this meaningful community outreach mission in the weekly church bulletins and announcements during the summer months. A special thank you to Pastor Adrian in giving an inspiring Backpack Blessing of the gathered backpacks at the Saturday and Sunday church services the first week in August and to the children and volunteers who helped assemble the backpacks after the 10:30 AM Sunday service. We would additionally like to thank Sherri Brewer, Kevin & Michelle Fisher, Lore Gochnour, Marie & Cliff Harkness, Joy Lein, Bill and JoEllen Lewis, Lonnie Nicosia, Jorge & Cash Sanchez, Ché Swanson, Lora Wichman, and Julie Winkler, who helped deliver the backpacks to the schools.

The schools were overjoyed and grateful for the backpacks we provided. "Those who are kind to the needy honor Him." (Proverbs 14:31). Your generous support shows how much GVPC cares in helping children in need and sharing the love of Christ in providing these children the tools and confidence to succeed and learn.

# Session Highlights September 2019

From the Stated Session Meeting of August 13, 2019:

#### **Music Director Search Committee**

Session voted to approve the Personnel Committee's recommendation of the hiring Tim Warren, part-time, as the Director of Music Ministries effective August 19, 2019.

**Clerk of Session** received a request from Jan Wilson to have her name removed from the GVPC rolls. A Certificate of Transfer was received from Rebecca Walls (Sottile). Member Harold (Hal) West went to be with Our Lord on August 12, 2019. He had been a member since November 15, 2008. He will be missed.

The Spring Presbytery Meeting will be held at Green Valley Presbyterian Church from March 8-11, 2020. Volunteers will be needed for various jobs.

#### **Worship and Music Committee**

Session voted to approve the GVPC Concert Series calendar of events from September, 2019 to May, 2020. A motion was made to approve Shakeh Ghoukasian as Artistic Director of the GVPC Concert Series with a one-year contract beginning August 1, 2019.

#### **Christian Education Committee**

A motion was made to approve the use of the following curriculums for the Fall 2019 Sunday School program: "Dwell" curriculum for ages 3 years through 8<sup>th</sup> grade and "52 Great Bible Studies for Youth" to be used in the High School classroom. The motion carried.

#### **Missions Committee**

The committee reported that 336 backpacks were filled and distributed for the 2019 Backpack Offering. Up 14% over last year.

#### **Administration Committee**

Session approved that the 1-year Mission Development Certificate purchased from the Synod of the Pacific in October 2018 be rolled into a new 3-year certificate when it matures. When the Mission Development Certificates mature in the future, the Administration Committee are delegated authority to decide if funds thus made available be cashed out and returned to the General Fund or rolled into a new certificate.

Session adopted the revised Facility Usage Policy presented by the Administration Committee.

Approval of the Gingerbread Fair Committee's donation of \$2500 toward the Audio System Upgrade be approved. The motion carried.

A motion upon Administration Committee recommendation that the lights in the parking lot and Multi-Purpose Building be converted to LED bulbs at a net cost to the church of \$4,875.00.

The motion carried.

#### **Property Committee**

The painting of the Sanctuary will begin as soon as the sound system is completed. The sound system upgrade should be in use for worship on August 31, and September 1, 2019.

### **Sunday Morning Children's Programs**

#### Welcome back as we begin our fall programs!

**Nursery care** for ages infant through 36 months is available in the Christian Education building every Sunday morning during worship from 8:45 until 11:45 am. Drop off children up to 15 minutes before the service begins and pick up after service ends. Two nursery attendants are present during services. For families who wish to keep their small children with them during the service, a cry room is available at the rear of the Sanctuary.

**Children's Rainbow Choir** is open to all students, pre-K and up, and practices on Sunday mornings from 9:50 to 10:20 am in the Christian Education building room #7. The choir sings at the 10:30 am service on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month. New members and visitors are welcome at any time.

**Sunday school** begins on Sunday, September 1 for ages Pre-Kindergarten through High School . Sunday School classes meet during the 10:30 am service in the Christian Education Bldg. Children start out the morning in the Sanctuary with their families. After the Children's Sermon students will be escorted to the C. E. Building where they will report to their assigned classrooms. Parents will pick up their children in the C. E Bldg. immediately after the service ends.

"DWELL" curriculum published by Faith Alive Resources has been selected for use in our Pre-K through Middle School classes. This multi-year curriculum is grounded in the Reformed perspective. "DWELL" invites kids to live into God's story of creation, fall, redemption, and restoration and encourages kids to live out of God's story every day as they respond to God's call. Each lesson includes activities based on multiple intelligence theory. The focus of the first 6-week units (Sept 1/Oct 6) are as follows:

Ages 3-4: Play - 9-month program based on 36 stories from Genesis through Acts.

K/1<sup>st</sup>: Imagine - Imagine being part of God's Family.

2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup>: Wonder - Wonder About God's Amazing Plan.

4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>: Marvel - Marvel at God's Love.

6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup>: Dive – What do I do when things fall apart?

"52 GREAT BIBLE STUDIES FOR YOUTH" curriculum from Faith Alive Resources has been selected for use in the High School class. These Bible studies are straightforward, easy to use, and great for high school students. These studies are designed to be self-lead by the students but will be assisted by an adult facilitator. Studies explore the topics of decisions, forgiveness, gossip, the kingdom of heaven, money and lifestyle, and Philippians: Living the joy, relationships, self-image, and service.

On Saturday, September 28, we welcome Ethicist and Theologian, Dr. Mark Douglas, as our second annual Theologian-in-Residence. Join us for an engaging presentation on current trends reshaping the faith and practice in America.

Dr. Douglas writes, "New technologies are transforming our working and living environments. The United States is simultaneously becoming more diverse and more gray at rates unequalled in the nation's history. Powerful new financial systems are reshaping growth and movement of capital. Is it any wonder that we're collectively feeling off-balance politically, economically, and, perhaps especially, spiritually? Maybe it is worth the church's time to think about how it and its members understand, participate in, and respond to dramatic changes?"

Mark will guide us in a morning of reflection on and conversations about trends reshaping faith in America. Refreshments will be served at 8:30 AM and our presentation will begin promptly at 9:00 am in the Sanctuary. In addition, he will also be preaching at our weekend services on Saturday, September 28 and Sunday, September 29.
