The theme for this year's stewardship campaign, "Blessed to be a Blessing" invites each of us to take an inventory of our lives, to reflect on the many ways we have experienced God's hand of blessing, and to consider how we will honor God with our gifts. Our theme is built on the conviction that God has gifted each one of us with something we can share because everyone has a part to play in building God's kingdom.

If you were to look at a map of the Holy Land, you would find the Sea of Galilee in the north is connected by the River Jordan to the Dead Sea in the south. The Sea of Galilee is brimming with life, surrounded by lush landscape. In contrast, the Dead Sea has no obvious signs of vegetation or life. One may ask, "Why?" The Sea of Galilee has an outlet in which its water flows into the River Jordan on its path southward. The Dead Sea, on the other hand, has no outlet to release its water. It's a vivid reminder that life comes from life and blessing comes from blessing. When we close our hearts and minds from opportunities to share God's blessings, we diminish our joy and purpose as followers of Christ.

This year our church has been blessed in ways too numerous to count because many of you have already made the principle, "Blessed to be a Blessing," a priority in your life. As your pastor, I could not be more grateful for the commitment to stewardship that is so evident at GVPC. Because of your faithful giving this year, we have accomplished wonderful things for the glory of God. Although I could never possibly name them all, several come to mind:

- Our youth attended Triennium on the campus of Purdue University where thousands of Presbyterian youth gathered for a week of inspiring worship, teaching, and fellowship.
- Our sanctuary has a new, much-needed sound system upgrade to enhance our worship experiences.
- This year's Theologian-in-Residence program with Dr. Mark Douglas challenged and inspired us to think creatively about new ways of doing ministry in order to more effectively reach youth and young families.
- Our property has been significantly improved with the painting of the sanctuary, and the installation of new LED lights in both the parking lot and fellowship hall building.
- At the recommendation of Session and upon the approval of the congregation, we have formed an Associate Pastor Nominating Committee as we look to expand our ministries to youth and families. Please hold our APNC in your prayers in their important work.
- This summer we hired our Interim Youth Director, Kerry Radke; our new Music Director, Tim Warren; and our Concert Series Artistic Director, Shakeh Ghoukasian. Each one of them is already making a notable impact on our ministries and outreach.
- The annual Gingerbread Fair raised over \$11,000 for future ministry projects and missions.

We have been blessed to be a blessing, and I am filled with joy and gratitude as I see what God is doing in our midst through your faithfulness. In this season of thanksgiving, I give deepest thanks for each of you.

Senior Resource Article

Nevada H.A.N.D., Inc.

Nearly half of all renters are paying more than the federal standard of 30% of their income for rent. Residents in Henderson and the entire Las Vegas Valley face a challenge as they search to find affordable housing.

Nevada H.A.N.D is the state's largest nonprofit 501© (3) and first affordable housing developer. They are dedicated to the development, management and administration of quality homes and supportive services for seniors who are living on a fixed income. The organization was founded in 1993 and serves some 7300 residents who meet the financial requirements. They now have 34 properties around the valley with 2 more scheduled to open in the fall of 2019.

Nevada H.A.N.D. has a significant presence at the State Legislature advocating for legislation that would increase the supply of affordable homes to ensure that more Nevadans have access to a safe and stable place to live along with a number of other benefits.

Some of the Nevada H.A.N.D. properties in Henderson include Annabelle Pines, Capistrano Pines, Horizon Pines, Pacific Pines, and Palo Verde. Further information can be found at www.nevadahand.org or (702) 739-3345. The office address is 295 E. Warm Springs Road, Suite 101, Las Vegas, NV 89119.

We plan to deliver the Hoodies to the schools the week of November 17th in advance of the week-long Thanksgiving break. **We need delivery drivers for each school and welcome and appreciate volunteers!** *We will have everything ready and all you have to do is drop them off at the school office.* We will also work with you as to the day and school you would like to make a delivery that week. SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The meeting of Session took place on September 24, 2019. The following information and motions were taken from this meeting.

Clerk's Report - Transfer of Membership request from George Stamos to Mountain View Presbyterian Church and Nell Jackson Covello to Anthem Community Church. Both requests were accepted, with regret, but hopeful they will be content in their new church homes.

Deaths – Member Hal West on August 12, member Brenda Atoz on August 26, member Rebecca Clark on September 7, and member Ed Wimberley on September 13, 2019. They will be missed.

Pastor's Report – Officiated at Memorial Services for members Anne Sophie Neal, Brenda Atoz, Hal West and a Funeral Service for Rebecca Clark. Communion was served to Jim Booker and Brenda Atoz accompanied by Elder Allen Randle. Numerous Pastoral Care and Hospital visits were made. Pastor Doll will be in Israel on Sunday, November 3 and 10, 2019. Rev. Dr. Ken Harper will be preaching during his time away and will be GVPC's Primary Pastor of Care. Rev. Al Moreau will also be available.

A motion was made to hold a Special Session Meeting for the purpose of receiving new members on Sunday, October 6. **The motion carried.**

Fellowship and Congregational Nurture – A motion was made to hold the Annual Advent Potluck Dinner on Sunday, December 8, 2019. **The motion carried.**

Membership and Outreach – **A motion was made** to approve a second concert by Finding Faith, with the date TBD, and with an honorarium of \$500 to this non-profit ministry, plus the proceeds from a goodwill offering. **The motion carried.**

Worship and Music - **A motion was made** to approve one service on Sunday, December 22 and December 29, 2019 and no Saturday evening services on those weekends. **The motion carried.**

Administration – **A motion was made** that the Workers' Compensation Policy be renewed for the term October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020. The estimated premium is \$2640. **The motion carried.**

A motion was made that the Multi-Peril Insurance Coverage be renewed for the term of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020. The premium is \$7720. **The motion carried.**

A motion was made that the Gingerbread Fair Committee be authorized to contract for another storage unit. The one-year cost is \$1009.16, which will be charged to the GBF Restricted Account. **The motion carried.**

Missions – **A motion was made** to approve the Missions Committee Coat/Hoodie Drive and authorize the request for donations and the expenditure of funds received for the purchase and delivery of outerwear "Hooded Sweatshirts" to children in need at Title I schools in the local area. **The motion carried.**

Stewardship – The theme for the 2020 Stewardship Campaign will be "Blessed to Be A Blessing."

Property – The painting of the Sanctuary is scheduled to begin on Monday, October 14 and is estimated to take five days to complete. A \$5,000 donation has been made to be directed at parking lot repair. A quote has been obtained from Ace Paving with more being pursued.

Henderson Food Bank

As we get into the upcoming holiday season, we want to give a few reminders when giving donations for Henderson Food Bank. We appreciate all the donations which are in such need, but we ask that you do a quick check of your items before dropping them off at church.

Dented canned goods

Canned goods like fruit, vegetables, ravioli, and tuna are staples, but before you drop them off, please check to ensure there are no dents, rust or other signs of damage — that could mean that the food inside is spoiled.

Open packages

Any partially-used products or open packaging cannot be accepted. Newly purchased items are best, but if you pull things from your pantry, check to be sure they are not opened or expired.

Expired foods

Products that are past their listed expiration date cannot be handed out at the food bank. If you think it's still perfectly good, better to use it up at home than risk it getting tossed at the food bank.

Glass jars

Fruit, sauces, peanut butter and other goods that are sold in glass jars should be avoided. They can easily shatter in transport, and food banks often cannot distribute them for safety reasons.

Once again, our guests were delighted with the home cooked meal! We served 75 hot meals, as well as 45 take- out meals.

Our "Lunch Brigade," is the GVPC group of volunteers who prepare sack lunches for FITD on the second Friday of the month. The sack lunches are the only meal that many of our Friends in the Desert get on Sunday, the one day when the kitchen at St. Timothy's is closed. *The "Lunch Brigade" members* provide two peanut butter and jelly sandwiches and *either* a piece of fruit, a fruit cup, or a pudding cup. The lunch bags will be provided; *volunteers simply drop off their sack lunches at GVPC on the 2nd Friday morning of the month.* Volunteers are not responsible for bringing other items that are added to the sack lunch. Also welcomed are gallon size bags of dog and cat food. If you wish to donate any of these items, you may leave them in the church office on week days or at the Saturday and Sunday services, along the back wall in the Sacristy. Bldg. immediately after the service ends.
