The Door of Humility

Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Philippians 2:9-11

Walking across the plaza toward the ancient Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem, I was overcome by competing emotions: excitement, wonder, and awe. This was the very site where tradition says the Christ of Bethlehem was born. In my mind, I expected to see a large, majestic, cathedral-like door marking the entrance to this holy and beloved site where Christians have worshipped for nearly two thousand years. Ironically, however, as our tour group made our way forward, I was struck by the contrast between my imagination and reality. The doorway to the Church of the Nativity is so small that one literally has to bow low in order to leave the busyness of Bethlehem and enter into the serenity of its basilica. Once a much larger door, the entrance was shortened to just over four feet during the Ottoman Empire in order to prevent people from storming the church on horseback.

Today, the main entrance to the Church of the Nativity is known affectionately as the "Door of Humility" because of the manner by which worshippers are forced to enter its holy space. Once inside, visitors are struck by the array of relics one associates with worship in the Eastern Church, including high ceilings, candles, incense, icons and mosaic floors, as they stand in line for hours in order to see the grotto beneath the altar. Tourists and religious pilgrims alike make their way down a narrow, uneven stairwell to a dark, cavernous space where a star on the floor marks the site of the Nativity. Some visitors just stand and take pictures. Others pass by unimpressed. But many others, faithful from around the world, bow in humble reverence out of deep gratitude for the One who came into our world to draw us to the heart of God.

As I made my way outside the Basilica into the harsh realities of the crowded, bustling, modern city of Bethlehem, I was struck by the symbolic journey of our brief time inside this holy space. Everyone, tourist and faithful alike, had to humble oneself in order to come near the site of Jesus' birth. As we move through the celebrations and busyness of the holiday season, we will always miss the main point if we don't take time in our overcrowded schedules to bow in humility – in our heart and mind – before the Christ of Bethlehem. The Scriptures tell us that even the Magi, some of the most learned, revered and majestic men of their day, humbled themselves in worship as they entered the home of Mary and Joseph and offered their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Of all the gifts any of us could offer Christ this year, the most cherished would be the gift of a humble heart, a heart ready and willing to worship Him as Lord. It's only then that any of us will see Christ for who He is, and see



ourselves for who we are, a people in need of God's infinite grace and mercy.


Men's Bible Study

Session Highlights October 2019

Associated Pastor Nominating Committee Update

The Session was presented with the final revision of the Ministry Information Form (MIF) from the APNC committee. The MIF was approved and forwarded to Nevada Presbytery for final approval.

Pastor's Report - Rev. Adrian N. Doll

The report for September/October 2019 included meetings with colleagues in ministry, preparations for the upcoming Journey of Faith to Israel, weekly meetings of the APNC, new members class, congregational meeting, parents of youth meeting, and the 2020 Stewardship Campaign.

Membership and Outreach Committee – Elders Doug Small and Dave Cornell

A motion was made to approve the purchase of 288 GVPC coffee mugs at a cost of up to \$1500.00. A motion was made to sell the coffee mugs to the congregation for \$10/each.

Worship and Music Committee – Elders Bill Ruby and Donna Rorer

A motion was made to approve an increase of the guest artist fund by \$1,500.00 beyond the current budget to complete the year.

A motion was made to approve a concert on January 5, 2020 with harpist Yvonne Cox. This event is sponsored by the GVPC concert series.

A motion was made to allow the sale of raffle tickets for the baskets with proceeds to the Messiah Concert. A motion was made for \$3,021.17 from Worship and Music/Supplies to assist with the payment of the new hymnals.

Christian Education Committee – Elders Sherri Brewer and Ann Fields

A motion was made to approve the use of the following curriculums for the Youth Group beginning January 2020: "Download Youth Ministries" and "Interlink Online"

A motion was made to approve the offsite lock-in activity for the youth group on New Year's Eve to be held at Grace Presbyterian Church.

A motion was made to approve funding for Julie Dorse to attend the "Children's Pastor's Conference" in Orlando, Florida in January 2020 for four days at a cost of approximately \$1650.00. This figure includes airfare, accommodations, conference fee, meals and shuttle service.

A motion was made to approve funding for Kerry Radke to attend the "Youth Ministry Conference" in November 2020 by authorizing the payment of the registration fee.

Missions Committee – Elders Susan Walker and Robert Brewer

A motion was made that Session approve payments in 2019 recommended by the Missions Committee as follows:

Authorize payment of \$5,000.00 from Account 5207 (General Assembly Missions) to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance General Relief and Support Fund.

Authorize payment of \$1,600.00 from Account 5207 (General Assembly Missions) to the PCUSA Agency for Missions support.

Authorize an additional payment of \$2,300.00 from Account 5208 (Non-Denominational Missions) to CARE for AIDS, Kenya.

Authorize payment of \$2,700.00 from Account 5209 (Undesignated) to CARE for AIDS, Kenya.

Authorize payment of \$3,000.00 from Account 5209 (Undesignated) to the Henderson Presbyterian Food Bank.

A motion was made that Session approve GVPC's participation in asking for volunteers to help serve an early Thanksgiving Dinner on the evening of Friday, November 22, 2019 to the families of homeless students at Basic Academy in Henderson.

Session Highlights (cont.)

Spring Presbytery Committee – This Presbytery meeting will be held at Green Valley Presbyterian Church from March 8 - 11, 2020.

A motion was made that Communion be served at the Tuesday worship service on March 10, 2020.

A motion was made to authorize and budget \$1,200.00 for potential expenses.

A motion was made to create a "Presbytery Meeting" Restricted Account and authorize Bernadette O'Neill and Carol Johnson to manage associated income and expenses with full accounting to Session.

Administration Committee – Elders Allen Randle and John Noel

A motion was made to approve the Restricted Funds Authorization for Spending effective November 1, 2019 through January 31, 2021.

There is one policy change which affects Account 8103 – Gingerbread Fair. In the past, all expenditures by the Gingerbread Fair Committee required approval by Session. In this authorization, authority to spend up to \$1,000.00 to support the operation of the fair (storage units, supplies, etc.) is delegated to the GBF treasurer. However, all improvements to the church facilities and equipment still requires approval by Session.

A motion was made that new computers be purchased for the Director of Children's Ministries, the attendance desk and the office assistant desk at a cost not to exceed \$3,000.00.

A motion was made to extend approval for Dave Tyrrell to serve check signer through January 15, 2020. The final budget amounts will be received at the December Session meeting.

Stewardship Committee – Elder Connie Mulick

The Stewardship Campaign for 2020 begins October 19-20, 2019. Pastor Adrian's stewardship sermon will be the weekend of November 16-17, 2019. Dedication weekend will be November 23-24, 2019.

Property Committee – Elders John Yates and Bobby Miller

A motion was made to replace six trees along Wigwam Parkway, add various plants, and remove and dispose of the old trees. This request is for an additional \$680.00 to the April 29, 2019 motion of \$1050.00 for a total of \$1730.00. (The original motion omitted the cost of tree removal and the additional plants.)

Foundation Assisting Seniors

A church member recently brought this organization back to my attention, when her husband played in their recent golf tournament. I wrote about one of their programs, the HOW R U program, in a previous article.

The Foundation Assisting Seniors was established in 2002 for seniors in times of illness, recovery, confinement at home, losing a loved one and other challenges at no charge. Since its inception, it has responded to over 200,000 requests for service. *"It is the ultimate goal of the Foundation to improve the overall quality of life for seniors by ensuring that they remain as safe and comfortable as possible in their own home as they age."*

Volunteers provide a number of services such as non-medical health assistance, limited home maintenance, transportation and mobility equipment.

- 1. **HowRU** Their HowRU program is a valuable, nationwide service that provides daily phone calls to seniors living alone to check on how they are doing. It has saved 7 lives according to their website.
- 2. **Medication Reminder** The Medication Reminder service is also a free program that calls subscribers daily to check up on them.
- 3. **Durable Medical Equipment** An inventory of durable medical equipment is maintained and delivered on a short-term loan basis to seniors in the valley as well as visiting seniors.
- 4. **Home Maintenance** Volunteers provide minor home maintenance such as replacing lightbulbs and adding salt to water softeners so seniors do not need to get on ladders or lift items that are too heavy.
- 5. **Transportation** Volunteers are available to provide transportation for seniors to Dr.'s appointments and shopping.

The amount is based on the number of members on each church's rolls. Per capita funding is the means by which the entire Presbyterian community mutually shares costs of operations. Your once a year payment supports the annual budgets of the Presbytery of Nevada, the Synod of the Pacific, and the General Assembly. Since these higher level councils do not have congregant income, all Presbyterian churches are asked to contribute to their operating costs. The 2020 per capita assessment is \$46.00 per member. We ask that you do not pay your assessment until after January 1, 2020. You can make your offering by: Writing "Per Capita" on the memo line of your check and placing it in the offering plate. Using a pew envelope and writing "Per Capita" on the outside of the envelope. You may also mail your payment directly to the church office with an appropriate notation with your payment. Thank you.
